

Leadership meeting of our Council

Early this month the Officers and other interested members met to set a plan for the fraternal year, so we are ready to go in September.

One of the first items on the agenda was a discussion of our priorities for the upcoming year. I believe a consensus was to try to attract new members, new ideas and a renewed commitment to our Council. Not that state and national priorities are not important, but the leadership was supportive that we need a renewed effort to focus on the local.

To that end, we talked about membership drives in the parishes and community and activity assignments, and there will be more on those topics as plans roll forward.

Ted Harrigan shared the results of the annual meeting of Grand Knights and Deputy Grand Knights sponsored by the State Council and intended to help and support local councils as they develop plans and programs. Interestingly, the State and National preference for new councils is to be parish-based and not independent with real estate facilities, etc. That ship has sailed for Needham Council, but we can respect the intent, through intensifying our involvement in and with our parishes. We will be seeking ways to do so and welcome your suggestions.

A budget committee was established under the leadership of our Treasurer, Tom Fern. Appointed to the Committee are the following:

We are also going to try to schedule a speaker at each meeting for 30 to 40 minutes to make it more interesting for our membership. If you can help line up speakers, let me know. It doesn't have to be a celebrity, any interesting and informative person will be welcomed.
