## Pro Life

A delegation of our membership had the honor and pleasure of attending the Annual Lantern Award Dinner on Patriots Day. The event shows the K of C at its best. The state officers and staff make an extra effort to honor the past and plan the future.

There is a connection to Church leadership and Patriotic themes, as well, to advance the Order's mission. This was very evident in this year's program which called for renewed efforts to defeat the abortion bills under consideration by the Massachusetts legislature. We were all encouraged to speak to our representatives and use our influence to defeat these extreme positions. And I want to add my voice to the call for pro-life positions and ask each of you to do the same. Following is the opening paragraph of Cardinal O'Malley's statement on the subject.

Our Commonwealth is facing an issue that holds significant moral implications for all citizens. At this time there are two bills (HB 3320 and SB 1209) proposed in the Massachusetts legislature which have extreme consequences for the protection of life. These bills have been described as a means of protecting the provisions of the Supreme Court's 1973 decision in

Roe v. Wade, but they go far beyond that decision and take us in dangerous <u>directions</u>. The bills are threatening to human life and dignity and should, in my judgement, be opposed even by those who support the Roe v. Wade decision.
