

Our first meeting of the year was very positive for the council and its future. Membership approved a budget for the year. We acknowledged shortfalls in 2018 and accordingly raised dues to \$60 per annum. Membership considered carefully the impact and decided that a modest increase would help us keep up with additional per capita charges and other expenses without disadvantaging vulnerable members. Thank you brothers for your approval.

While I'm on the subject, let's acknowledge the privileged position we enjoy, being proprietor of a desirable retail property. We are blessed with a superb team of property managers led by Bob Timmerman and Joe Mecagni. Also countless helpers over time that have assured us the opportunity to enjoy a beautiful and very useful facility for our Council Meetings and event needs. We also have been able to make the Hall available for Catholic efforts to spread the faith through conducting meetings to further their mission. I am thinking of especially the Catholicism Series by Bishop Baron over the summer, the Bible Study series just beginning and the Massachusetts Catholics for Life Group that is using our facility for their efforts. We are blessed and happy to make our blessings available to the wider Catholic community. Let's remember in a special way our forebears who made decisions for the long term that enable us to continue to uphold the K of C values.

To that end, we have scheduled a Memorial Mass at St. Bartholomew Church at 9:45 for our deceased members on Sunday, October 7, 2018. We will also conduct our recruitment drive in conjunction with the Parish Community Sunday on that same day, Sunday October 7, 2018. I hope for a strong turnout of members for recruitment at the 8:00 and 9:45 Masses and attendance

as a body for the 9:45 Mass for our deceased members. Even if you don't normally attend St. Bartholomew Church, please make an exception on this weekend to remember and honor our forebears, who did an outstanding job as Knights of Columbus in our community of Needham over the years.

Also, recruitment of new members is a high priority for our council. New members will bring new energy, new ideas, and new commitments. This will insure that the Daniel Kennedy Council will continue to be a positive force for Catholic action in Needham in the years to come.

October

October will be a very busy month and starts on the first Wednesday with our October meeting.

Families are invited for dinner and installation of officers that will precede the formal meeting, which will probably begin around 8:15 PM. District Deputy Bryan Choate will conduct the installation. It will be a meaningful evening and will help us carry out one of the very nice K of C traditions. Further, Bob Timmerman has volunteered to be chef for the evening and he promises something different for a very special evening. Bob always does a great job and knows how to please his audience. Please join us.

Also charity of the month will be a collection for Little Sisters of the Poor. As many of you know they are dedicated to serving the elderly poor, a category that is sometimes forgotten in our reality. The Sisters are very faithful and mission-oriented and occasionally need help. Now is one of those times. They have a candidate for entry into the Order, a local girl, graduate of Notre Dame, who needs to pay off student loans before she may gain entry. If we could take a collection at our meeting and raise a few hundred, I am sure it would be meaningful. For the Sisters, welcoming a new entrant is very exciting and affirming. Our help will send a message of thanks and support to the Sisters and will be deeply appreciated.

Recruitment under PGK Ron Hadley will get underway seriously in October. Ron has scheduled recruitment drives at St. Bart's on October 7 and St. Joseph's on October 21 and 22. We need a strong turnout at each Mass for these events. This is our chance to speak to parishioners that may want to join our Order, but have not had the opportunity. I am sure there are many. Please come and help.

Also as noted above, the 9:45 Mass on Sunday October 7 at St Bartholomew will be for our deceased members. We need a strong turnout of brothers for this event. We will process in to Mass and sit together. Let's honor our forebears with a good example for the congregation, especially families of the Parish.

Brothers Ken Gustin and Tom Fern are again heading up the Tootsie Roll drive for disabled children and adults. We will begin with Church collections. St. Bartholomew will be September 30 and 31 and St. Joseph, October 13, 14. We need brothers to help at all Masses. Please let Tom or Ken know your schedule and join us at the end of each of the Masses. Of all our charitable work, this is one of the most meaningful. It provides assistance for individuals and families that really need our help. They deal with difficulties and if our intervention helps ease a burden, we are fulfilling our mission as Knights. I urge all to participate. Later in the fall, in November, we

Our Deputy Grand Knight continues to offer the men's discussion group each first Saturday. He gave some thoughts on the subject recently and I believe it may be worthwhile to review his message to us.

Hello, Men -

These are terrible times for us Catholics – for those ravished by abuse, for their loved ones suffering with them, for those whose innocence and faith is shattered by scandal, and for those faithful laity and clergy who reel in grief from each new revelation of misconduct and cover-up. We see, with great sorrow, that Judas is alive and active in the Church. Perpetrators and enablers within the Church structure are the proper objects of our righteous anger. Let us not allow that anger to be directed against the Church herself. To paraphrase Bishop Robert Barron in one of the recent *Catholicism* videos, the Church is holy not because of its members (including clergy) but because of its Founder. As Peter replied to Our Lord in John's gospel last Sunday, "Master, to whom shall we go?"

So, as Catholic men, to whom shall we go? We have been given a time not of certainty and triumphalism, but of challenge amid the apparent ascendancy of sin. What shall we do in our time? May I humbly suggest that we double down in prayer together, that we might be strengthened as men to protect and defend ourselves, our families and our Church from the evil lurking in Man's fallen nature. We need each other, Guys. Each of us has a gift to bring to the struggle. Together, we are strong. So, if you haven't come to our group for a while, please consider returning this Saturday, or on October 6. We'll leave the coffee on for ya!

The first Saturday falls on the 1st this month. If you're around town this Labor Day weekend, come on down for fellowship, song, scripture, reflection and robust discussion. Saturday morning, Sept. 1 at 7:00 AM. Coffee will be on at 6:30. Usual location: K of C Hall, 1211 Highland Ave. (rear entrance.) Please invite a friend or neighbor, for fellowship with other Catholic men. As a longtime member of our group says, "you'll be GLAD you did!"

Our intention and deep prayer this month is that the Holy Spirit descend upon, purge and purify all members of His Church with a "cleansing fire."
